Psalm Response: On your right stands the queen, in garments of gold.

Have courage to stare into heaven

Today's joyful feast, "The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary", reminds us about Heaven - . that blue sky above us with its unending dimensions. Many say that only dreamers or idealists look at heaven. We don't have time for such ridiculous things, as we have to stand firm on the ground, do our daily stuff, make money, do business. We don't have time to look for heaven. Maybe that's why we often feel so bad, these days. Maybe that's why there are so many depressed people of all ages, people who don't see any sense in their life, people who feel useless or on the opposite overburdened with life?

For Christians, heaven is not just some blue dimension above. For we who believe, who see more, heaven means God himself. God is open for us, ready to share our daily routine with us, to sanctify all our good efforts. Let us look at Mary the heroine of today's feast. She is not a dreamer. She stands firmly on earth. Today we meet her, when she goes to Elisabeth, to help her. She had to travel for about 100 miles from Galilee to Judea. Plan that trip, make all preparations, watch for thieves, robbers, enemies. She arrives at Elisabeth's house ready to serve her. She must have been a very practical woman but at the same time she was not ashamed of watching above, raise her eyes to heaven, to God. From him she received strength to cope with all adversities and daily routine.

In today's gospel we hear about Mary singing the *Magnificat,* "My soul magnifies God, my spirit joys in Him". I think that to watch for heaven in our Christian sense means to proclaim the great deeds of the Lord. To be aware of the proportions. God is great, and I am small, He is my father and I am his child, it's His job to look after me, I don't have to do all on my own, because He is ready to help me, to give me strength and courage. To exalt God means to perceive life is good, real proportions, to see things as they should be seen. Doing that can bring us much relief.
