### Faith and the Last Things

What makes us ask about God? Where do we find Him? Although there is no simple answer to this question, it looks like we think more seriously about Him when we believe in the edge of life; when we approach a metaphorical cliff, after which there is only an ocean and everything around us says: stop. Then it is a moment of touching base. Interestingly enough, we are more open to God when we realise that we are really 'short' and there is no-one to help us. For instance, consider the case of Zacchaeus (*Lk* 19:1-10) and the invalid man who at the Sheep Gate asked the Lord: *Sir, I have no one to help me into the pool when the water is stirred. While I am trying to get in, someone else goes down ahead of me (Jn* 5:7). Before that often we are either not interested or mistaken about Him. Before reaching our lowest point, we have our own agendas. Before that moment we are talkative about Him. Faith is often born in the context of touching death of all kinds: spiritual, moral, social, physical. Only then we start screaming in the depths of our hearts: Where are you my God?

We will be blessed if one day a priest will pray over our coffin: May the angels lead you into paradise; may the martyrs come to welcome you and take you to the holy city, the new and eternal Jerusalem. It is good to have the image of that moment in our heads. It really helps our faith to develop in many areas. Our unhealthy attachments disappear, we simplify our demands and needs, we stop treating God like the next door neighbour, etc. Everything is then in another order. The Last Things of man are death, judgment, heaven and hell. Death is the separation of body (mortal) and soul (immortal). At the moment of death, we experience one-to-one judgement by God based on our life. We will go immediately to our reward or punishment. There will be time for purification called purgatory but only for those who are in the state of imperfection and are in preparation for their entry to heaven. After that it will be the end of the world. Then we will rise again to be judged by Jesus Christ (all living and dead). The body and soul will come back together. Only at that time will God's whole plan for the world will be revealed.
