Closer to Christ Campaign. The aim for the diocese is to raise £13.5 million to support our clergy from formation into retirement and support the parishes. The diocese would like parishioners to pledge certain amount for 5 years. Our Parish's share is £90,000 for 5 years of which the diocesan share is £60,300. The remaining £29,7000 is for our own Parish projects. Fr Stan has decided not to go for this approach as he did not want to put the pressure on individual parishioners to make commitment for 5 years towards the campaign.
