Psalm Response:

You open wide your hand, O Lord, and grant our desires.

Grace through involvement

There is a picture of Jesus feeding the five thousand with just five barley loaves and two fish. Our Lord could have told the people to take care of themselves. He did not do that. He also could have multiplied the bread and fish on His own, which would have been a quicker and more practical solution. He did not do that either. Neither of these responses aligns with the mind of Jesus. Instead, He engaged His disciples and the people who listened to Him attentively. This shows that other reasons matter; the key point is that what we hear should transform us into who we are meant to be.

To understand the heart of Jesus, we must know that He opted for human involvement and collaboration with grace. Mere distribution of goods and handouts is not the solution.

We can see Christ's way of thinking more closely through the lens of a Chinese proverb and the attitude of Mother Teresa of Calcutta towards it.

The Chinese proverb rightly states: "You give a poor man a fish and you feed him for a day. You teach him to fish and you give him an occupation that will feed him for a lifetime."

Paraphrasing Mother Teresa, she added something significant about the nature of the human condition marked by original sin and redemption, and marked by omission and negligence of love and examples: "The poor are so weak they cannot stand. Give them a fish to strengthen them. When they are strong, give them a rod and teach them to fish."

Christianity first guarantees the foundation. It is the Body and Blood of Christ given up for us. which is the source of life and the fundamental base. Next, we are provided with an environment and lessons on how to live. Finally, we are called to live independently and responsibly within the framework of what is our life in Christ.

By involving His disciples in the miracle of feeding the five thousand, Jesus taught them the importance of active participation in His mission. He did not just perform the miracle; He does not want us merely waiting for miracles to happen. We are to strive to engage with grace, fostering growth in Christ through independent responsibility in ourselves and others.
