Psalm Response: Praise the Lord, who raises the poor.

Money as a tool, not a master.

The Gospel makes it clear: money and material goods are tools, never ends in themselves (Lk 16:1-13). They are not the goal of life, yet they are woven into our humanity. Likewise, the prophet Amos (Am 8:4-7) warns that wealth without justice crushes the poor and blinds the heart.

We do engage with material things, for money gives tangible shape to values: it fills the stomach. clothes the body, and sustains daily life. Fragile bodies need space to dwell, utilities to cover, and work to provide. We rest, feed and clothe our families, and educate children so they may find their place in the world. These real needs remind us that we are called to serve life rightly—using intellect and will not only for ourselves, but also to help others grow. Within the limits of what we have, and within the vast potential of our creativity and prudence, we are invited to act without naivety, yet also without fear.

Our Lord praises the steward's foresight, not his dishonesty. He shows that even "the children of this world" know how to act decisively when their future is at stake. How much more, then, should disciples act wisely for the sake of God's Kingdom. Jesus calls us to courage and creativity with what is given even in matters of eternal life, in the shaping of values, and in cultivating a Christian culture that can stand firm amid the challenges of "woke" fluidity. With God's grace, we often discover that we hold more in our hands than we imagine. And when we dare to use it with love, it bears fruit. We are called to live boldly, to be resourceful in goodness, and to let even the smallest gift become light for someone else.

For this reason, spirituality and daily life can never be separated. Prayer itself must not become an escape from responsibility, nor can faith be twisted to exploit the faithful in God's name. Authentic prayer deepens love, strengthens responsibility, awakens courage, and teaches us to care for one another. It opens our eyes to injustice and gives us the strength to resist it. Fr Stan.
