## St Edmund of Abingdon, the Principal Patron of Our Diocese.

St Edmund of Abingdon was born around 1175 and lived for about 65 years. He had a deep love for mathematics and dialectics, as well as for the ascetic life and theology. He cherished Aristotle and the Holy Scriptures—everything for a greater love of God. His industrious spirit and zeal were inspired by his father. a dedicated merchant, and his mother, who taught him religious practices. Beneath it all was Our Lady herself. From her, he drew a love for discipline and justice, intertwined with the spirit of evangelical purity and poverty, even as he became the first known Oxford Master of Arts and later a bishop.

As a young heart, he was wholly devoted to God through Mary. From an early age, he experienced Mary as his spiritual guide. At just twelve, while studying in Oxford, he made a "sacred marriage" to her, placing a ring on a statue of Our Lady in the Church of St. Mary the Virgin—a ring that miraculously could not be removed.

By consecrating himself to Mary in this "spiritual marriage," Edmund entered into a living communion with her, a relationship of trust and mutual love, through which he was led more deeply into God. Mary, as mediator of all graces, guides and strengthens everyone who entrusts themselves to her care.

Throughout his life, Mary remained his protector and counselor. He received visions, including one of his mother depicted as Theology, which encouraged him to pursue theological studies. His love for Mary strengthened him in his ascetic practices, his scholarly pursuits, and even in his courageous defense of the Church as Archbishop of Canterbury.

Edmund's devotion to Mary was not private; it shaped his ministry and inspired others. He is remembered as a reforming bishop, a faithful teacher, and a peacemaker. His life encourages us to allow Mary to guide us, to embrace prayer and study, and to live with courage and humility in our daily responsibilities.

St Edmund of Abingdon reminds us that a life rooted in Mary's love is a life of spiritual depth, moral courage, and gentle service. His example invites us to offer ourselves to Mary's care, trusting her to lead us ever closer to Christ.
