Meditation on Beatitudes as true moment of enlightenment

We are pilgrims. We are earthly pilgrims on an earthly pilgrimage heading to unknown world.

They point out the richness of human and divine life, and in this way they bring back lost integrity and stability of hearts.

We are people made out of clay, we are on the journey where dust and mud are known to us.

The revelation of the reality of human hearts happened on the Mount of Beatitudes. It was the moment of true enlightenment of humanity. On that mountain Jesus announced and embraced all human desires, and all God's promises starting from those given in Paradise and to Abraham.

Every pilgrim, every believer, is marked by dust, clay and mud - as well as by God's blessing; by Christ.

God's blessing comes in Christ as the epiphany, as the revelation of the real face of God to us.

The Beatitudes help us also to see what really make us happy, as the desires of our souls simply have the divine origin.

God's blessing comes also as the revelation to us of what is in the depths of the hearts of every man and woman; as a revelation of who I am and who you are.

The Beatitudes bring answer to the natural desire for happiness, hidden in our hearts. It is because God himself has implanted them in our hearts.

In our hearts there is the most natural style of life named by Jesus Christ as the Eight Beatitudes. Because these Beatitudes are in the centre of Jesus' teaching, in the centre of each of them is the Kingdom of Heaven.

When we listen carefully ourselves, we will be attracted to them. Interestingly enough, only God can meet our desires with His blessings formulated in Beatitudes.

The Beatitudes teach us about the final goal of our life - the kingdom of God, the vision of Christ, participation in His eternal life, in holiness.
